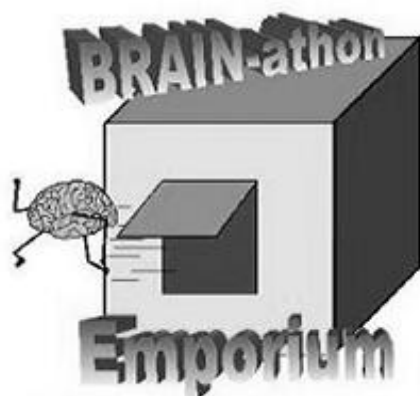

## FRIDAY 12:30 – 1:30 PM - SESSION 1

### **Resolving Family Conflicts in Truth and Love** (*Phil Downer*)

Learn the do's and don'ts of how to bring up and deal with the smoldering issues, keep difficult discussions from escalating, work through the toughest issues, and change negative patterns of interaction to positive ones. It is imperative that we not merely teach our children but work through and resolve old hurts and resentments that can undermine our efforts to grow them into godly leaders. This powerful workshop is designed to help you build relationships that are closer than ever before.

### **Learning: A Breath-Taking View** (*Diana Waring*)

Does that ring true in your heart? Is learning a breath-taking adventure in your home school, or more of a weary, forced-march, plodding through endless subjects? One of the biggest questions people ask is, "How do I get my kids to finish their school work?" The deeper question is actually, "How do I get my kids to be self-motivated?" We will examine the answers to these critical questions, and look at specific ways to encourage and assist our children in developing ownership of their education. Yagottahavagottawanna is the attitude we want our children to catch, but we must learn the proper approach which will allow them to catch it! That means we must learn the critical difference between controlling and directing; between pushing and releasing; between coercing and facilitating. It is the essence of a master teacher who says, "I can not teach you how to do it, but I can help you learn to do it." This is an interactive and practical workshop that you can put to use immediately!

### **Testing 1-2-3: Before & After Testing** (*Betty Statnick*)

This session will "tease out" some matters related to testing: types of tests (not just achievement tests), terms used, tips to prepare for testing, possible temptations as a result of testing, using tests as teaching tools.

In this fast-paced, easy-to-understand workshop, you will distinguish three different grids that impact the unique way each one in your family learns: learning modalities (visual, auditory, kinesthetic); learning styles (Feeler, Thinker, Sensor, Intuitor); learning intelligences (interpersonal, intrapersonal, linguistic, spatial, math-logical, bodily-kinesthetic, musical, naturalist). Discover how to honor (not curse!) that wiggler in your midst; how to create a rich atmosphere for learning that will attract every learner; how to utilize your children's strengths to learn subjects that are hard for them; most importantly, learn that God delights in the incredibly individualized mechanisms for learning inside each of us! With this insight, including new research on intelligences, you will be able to adapt your teaching strategies AND choose your curriculum wisely!

### **Dad’s Irreplaceable Role** (*Phil Downer*)

This is a practical and biblical session on the father's role in training the homeschool family and leading the home. Dad needs to be engaged in instructing, but also in building strong character and strong relationships. He is called to be a strong leader and yet gentle and humble. He is not just a coach, but God’s player-coach. And one of the most powerful secrets of how Dad can be all these things is to start by being a three letter word: fun!

### **Q & A with Betty Statnick** (*Betty Statnick*)

### **Raising Dynamic Leaders for Christ in an Entertainment-Saturated World** (*Paul Downer*)

It is a philosophy that has persuaded each of us in countless ways (both with and *without* our knowledge) to buy into a specific belief system regarding every aspect of our culture and lives. 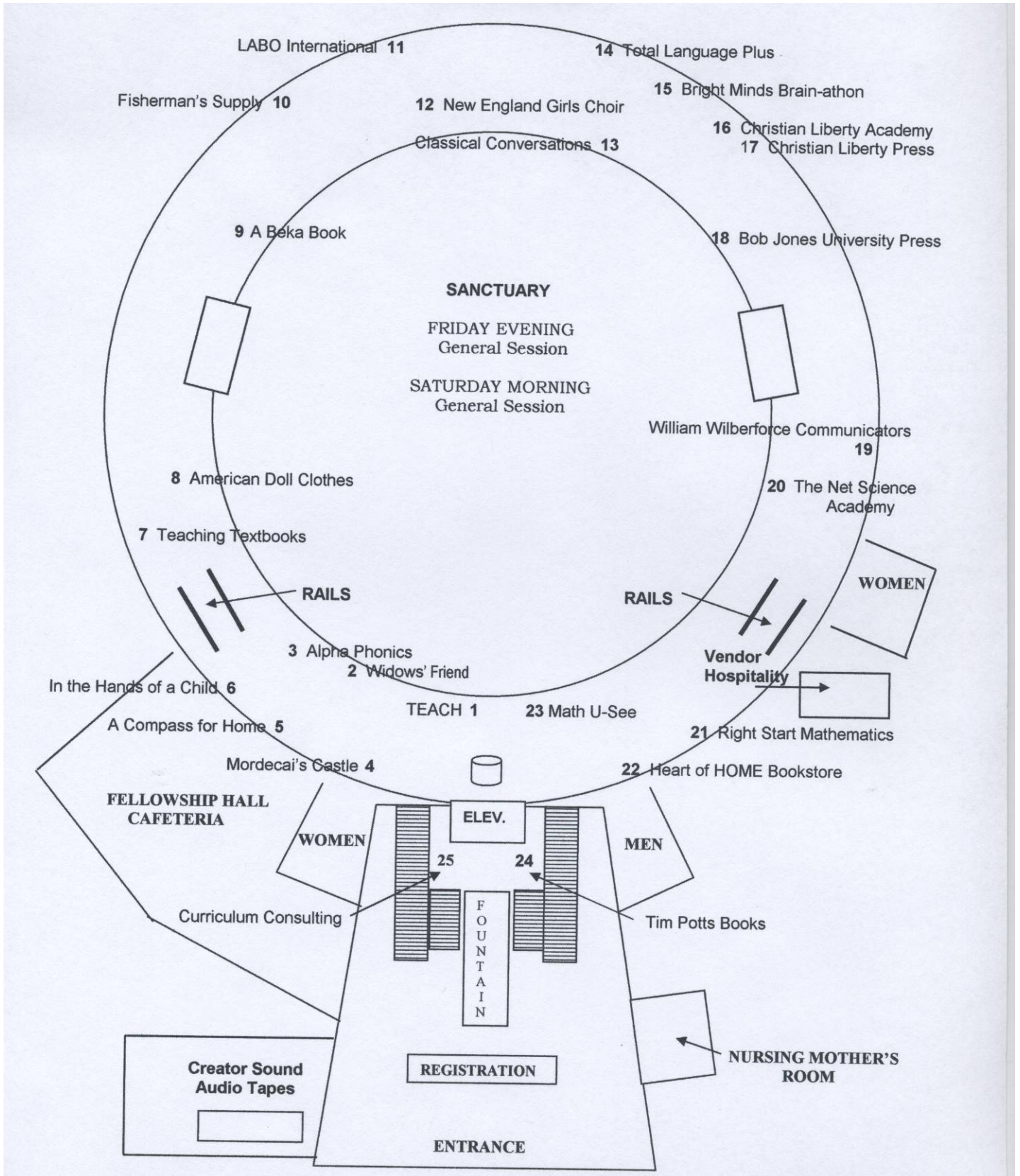

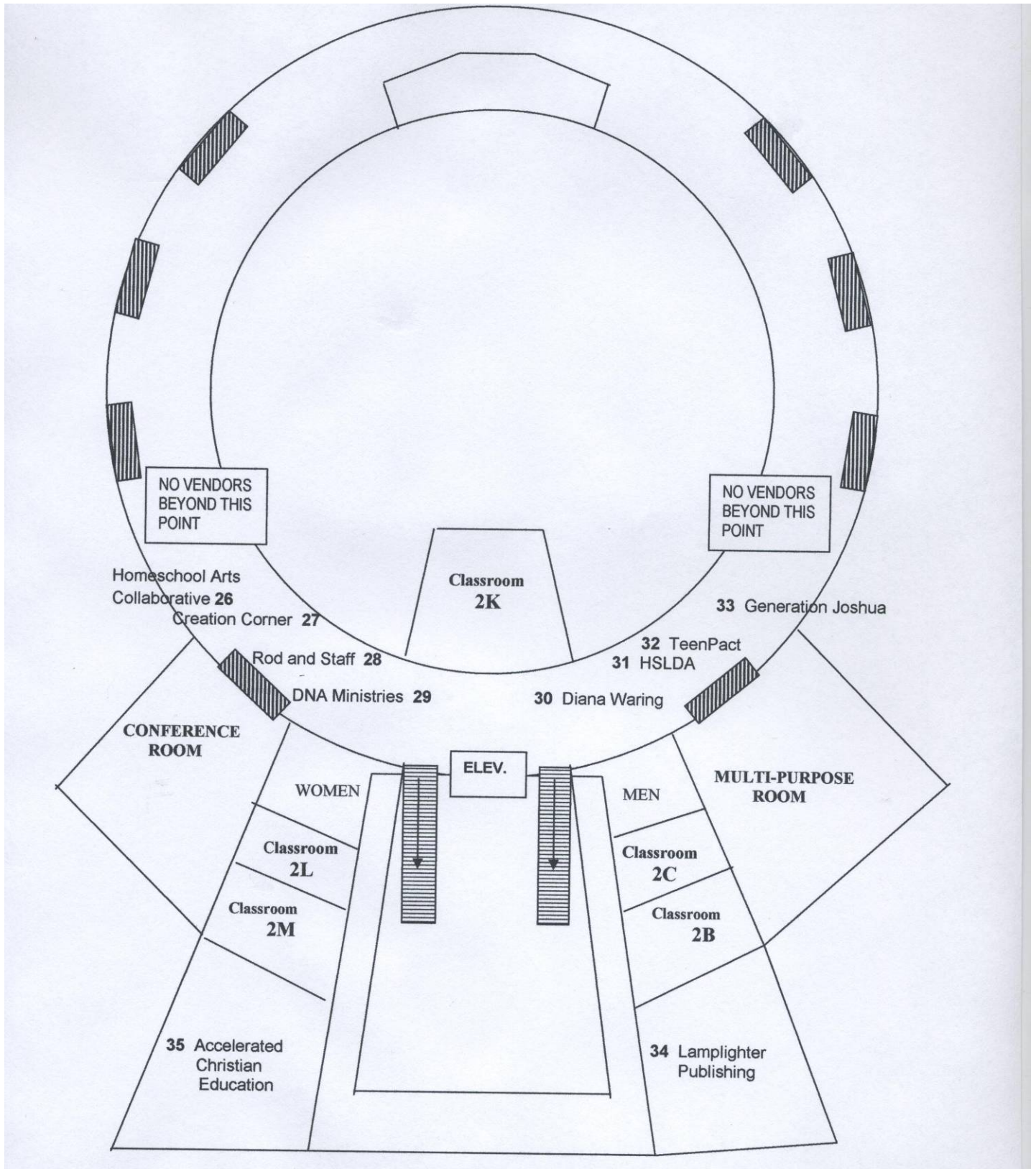
