Featured Speakers



Rachael & Davis Carman

Davis and Rachael Carman are passionate about their work. They have been happily married since 1986. They live near Charlotte, North Carolina where they are raising their seven children. The kids range in age from 5 to 18 with two boys on one end, two boys on the other, and three girls tucked safely in the middle. The Carman family has been enjoying the adventures of the homeschool lifestyle since 1996 when God “got their attention.” A Christian radio station manager had this to say about Davis and Rachael: “[They] have the unique ability of turning their personal experiences with homeschooling into encouraging lessons for all of us... and they are lessons that transcend homeschooling. They are about a life devoted to The Truth. God has used them to uplift, refocus, and teach many people, myself included.”

God has this wonderful knack of teaching us His most valuable lessons through some of life's most rattling moments. Several of Carol's journeys (both painful and pleasant) are the fuel of her speaking and writing material. Through a long medical ordeal for her son, involving 13 surgical procedures before he was 3½, Carol learned the powerful lesson that she wasn't in control. When she and her husband couldn't bring themselves to medicate this ADHD child, particularly after his already long medical history, Carol found herself doing the unimaginable – home schooling! That will grow you & rattle you simultaneously. But convinced that it was the best option for her son, she plunged in. She learned over time that all of the traditional methods that she knew and cherished from her own childhood were a recipe for disaster with this very different child. So through much experimentation, coupled with a belief that this child's energy was a gift from God, she developed strategies and teaching methods that worked with his need for constant motion.

FRIDAY 12:30 – 1:30 PM - SESSION 1

Praise Him in the Storm (*Davis Carman*)

Have you had times in your life when everything seems to go wrong - even though you are seeking God with all your heart? Davis Carman can relate. In this session, Davis gives his personal testimony leading up to the purchase of Apologia. He describes the religious discrimination he encountered while trying to get a business loan to buy the creation-based science curriculum publisher - a fight worth fighting even though the cost was high. Davis' story is a roller coaster ride involving extended unemployment, the fight for a dream, and perseverance with joy. He recounts how God provided for his family's every need through the body of Christ. Learning how God displays His strength when we are weak became a foundational aspect of his faith. In this session, we will discover how God works powerfully in our lives—especially in the midst of the storms we often encounter.

Soaring Beyond Survival (*Rachael Carman*)

Homeschooling is not easy. As a matter of fact, sometimes it gets downright overwhelming. This can be a time when it is tempting to slip into survival mode. Homeschooling is the adventure of a lifetime and God will be your strength. It is not His will that you to just survive, He wants you to thrive. Come hear what it takes to soar like an eagle.

A Prodigal Speaks Out (*Carol Barnier*)

Do you have a child who is doubting his faith? Or perhaps a daughter who has rejected your beliefs completely? Are you convinced you've failed...and the state of this child's heart is weighing heavily on you and your spouse? Come and listen to Carol share her own journey away from and back to her faith after 13 years as an atheist. She'll share thoughts and views from inside the mind of a lost child. You'll learn the best thing you can do for this child and for yourself. Come and find an understanding heart that hurts and rejoices along with your own.

Beyond Homeschooling (*Graduate Panel*)

Is there really life after homeschooling? Come hear a panel of homeschool graduates whose post-high-school plans represent a variety of options. Some of these successful young men and women have chosen college, and some have not; however, all of them will encourage and inspire you as you consider the next step after high school.

Every day we are bombarded with messages that try to convince us that we are individually important. The basic theme is that we should seek self. It's all a big lie, from the king of lies. We must shift our focus away from ourselves and on to our awesome and mighty God. The world is relentlessly pursuing peace and contentment that can only come from a life that is totally surrendered to Christ and His will. Come learn how this realization radically changed Rachael's life's direction and purpose. It can change yours too!

Don't Miss the Gift in This Child (*Carol Barnier*)

Have you ever heard someone say "All children are gifts from God" only to roll your eyes and think... "Ha! They don't know what goes on in my house!" If you don't look for God's gifts, you may be missing some of His best. Come laugh and be encouraged to see just what God had in mind when he designed your child. Learn how to see your child through God's spectacles and how to stay focused on God's vision of your child...not the world's.

Getting Started (*Molly Farrington*)

FRIDAY 6:30-8:30 PM – GENERAL SESSION

Deuteronomy 6 and Beyond (*Davis Carman*)

Deuteronomy 6 is a classic scripture admonishing parents to teach their children diligently when sitting at home, when walking along the way, when lying down, and when getting up. There are many more places in God's Word that speak to home education and family discipleship. Whether you are at the crossroads considering home education, a few years into it deciding whether to stay the course, or a veteran in need of affirmation, the truth found in God's Word will set you free. Davis shares several of these inspired verses in a way that brings God's wisdom all the way home.

SATURDAY 9:00 – 10:00 AM – SESSION 4

APPLES for the Teacher (*Davis Carman*)

The gift of a fresh, shiny apple still represents respect and gratitude towards one's teacher. Why should it be any different for the homeschool mom? They typically carry the lion's share of the homeschool workload. To help them avoid burnout, husbands need to help their wife avoid feeling 100% of the homeschool responsibility. Your wife needs to hear "thank you" in many different ways and know for sure that you are engaged. In this session, Davis gives real and practical ideas for supporting your wife in the homeschool journey.

Mother – More Than Just the Heart of Her Home (*Rachael Carman*)

In Proverbs 14.1 the Bible says "the wise woman builds up her house, but the foolish woman tears it down with her own hands." Everyday we make choices to either build up or tear down. And we do it in a variety of ways with our ears, our eyes, our mouth, and of course our hands. Imagine the generation God could build up through us!

Margins for Moms – Limits That Liberate (*Carol Barnier*)

Too often we've just accepted how busy our lives our supposed to be. But many of us are running through life in a frenzied fog. We have a nagging sense that it shouldn't be this way, but don't know how it should be. Even if we did, we often don't know how to get from here to there. With a bit of laughter and an unabashed challenge of the status quo, learn to take control of the input and output of your family's lives.

Principles for Principals (*Fathers Panel*)

Join a facilitated discussion of fathers, led by a homeschooling father. Experienced fathers will share their experiences of homeschooling – how they stay involved, how they support their wives and children, and how they provide leadership to their families.

Online Videos – Using Videos To Build Your Business Or Share the Gospel (*Linda Joseph*)

This workshop will cover the basics of putting videos online and how videos can be used to bring customers to your business or share the Gospel.

Homeschool Castles (*Davis Carman*)

Castles of old were built to last for thousands of years. Many are still standing today for visitors to admire. What are we building in our family homeschools today? Is there a manual or blueprint to follow? Why are we doing this? Will the sacrifice be worth it? In this session, Davis visits family past, present, and future analyzing trends and creating a vision for an exciting future worth working towards. All the reasons why God is moving in the homeschool community may be hard to understand in the context of present history, so it will take faith. We may not see all the fruit in our lifetime, so it will call for hope. Better start building now; your great-grand children will thank you.

Oddly Wrapped Gifts: Find God's Gifts in Life's Toughest Moments (*Carol Barnier*)

Guilt, anger, depression, jealousy, guilt...there is an extraordinary gift residing within. How to go through the process of claiming these gifts and freeing yourself from the damaging power of the painful accompaniments that often take up residence.

Family – Our Best Apologia Ever (*Davis Carman*)

Apologia is a Greek word meaning “defend the faith.” In a society saturated with an evolutionary perspective, students need to be taught from a Biblical worldview. The statistics show that a very small percentage of born again believers have a worldview consistent with basic Christian doctrines. The internet, movies, music, books and other media heavily influence the thoughts, beliefs, and corresponding actions of young people. How can homeschool parents help their children stand firm with a solid Biblical worldview? Certainly one solution can be the use of good books and curricula including creation-based science curricula. The best way is by example in the context of family. Davis will explain how raising children in a family setting where Christ is worshipped and where the Word of God is the primary text can fulfill the great commission and result in generational faithfulness. Family is truly our best defense of the Christian faith.

Teaching Truth – A Solid Foundation (*Rachael Carman*)

What is truth? You and your family need to know the answer. It is foundational that our children understand that truth exists and is absolute. Rachael shares a total of six truths about truth that Christians need to instill in the minds of their children. She will demonstrate the motions that can be used to make the learning fun and easy to remember.

What Are You Thinking? - Learning Styles and Beyond (*Carol Barnier*)

This talk is BIG on the beyond. So often, learning style materials pour all their time and energy into finding the right label for your child's learning style. (Yes, we now know he's a right brained, global, sub-dominant, argyle-wearing, rational wombat...but how do I teach him to spell?) And while there are many different tools for assessment, too often these same materials are light on just what you should do *after* the label. How do you teach history so it sticks? What if she can't understand fractions? What if he loves language but hates to write? This workshop will be all about "What do we do now?" come away with lots of ideas you can use Monday morning.

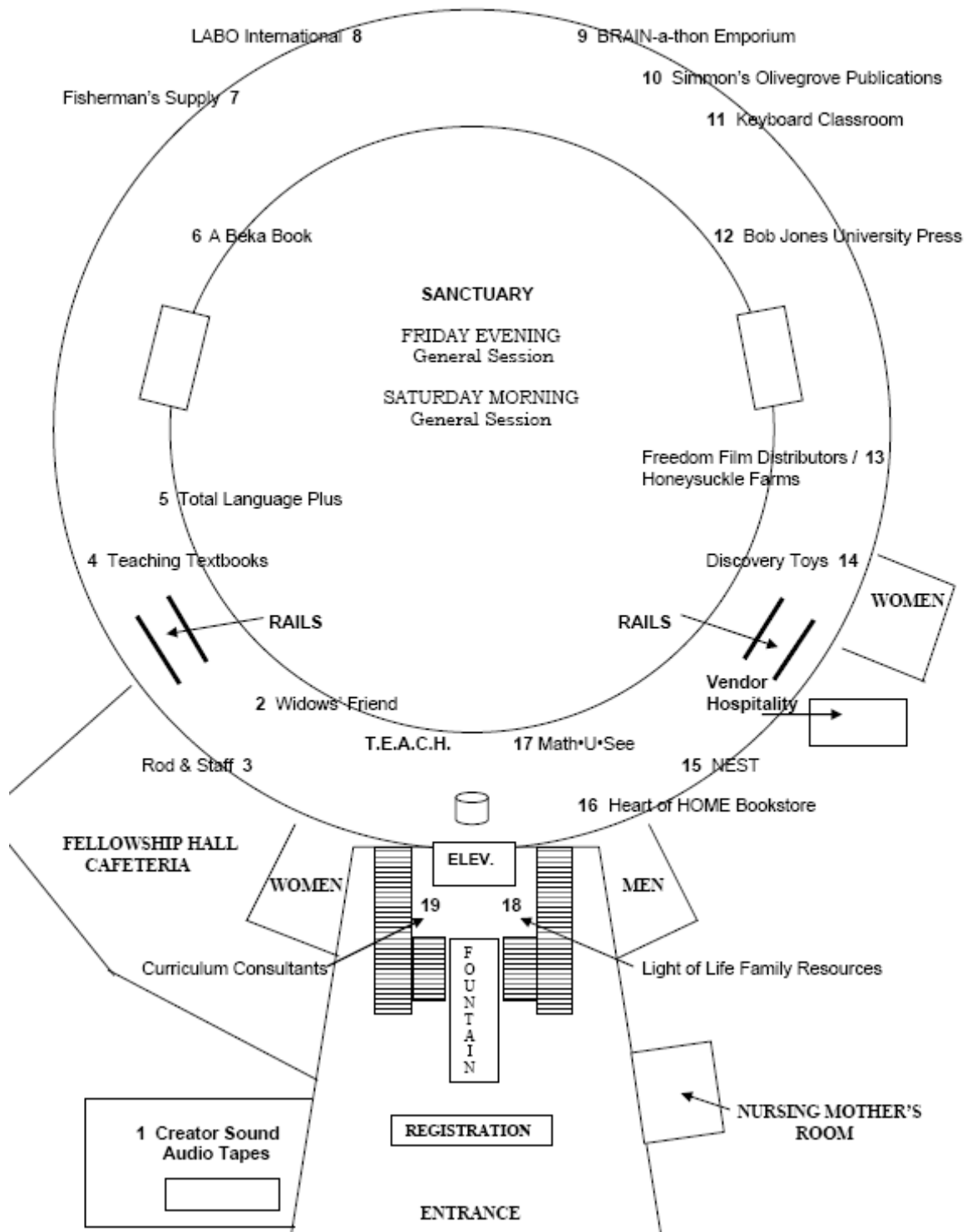
Everything You Wanted To Know About Starting An Online Business Or Bringing Your Offline Business Online (*Linda Joseph*)

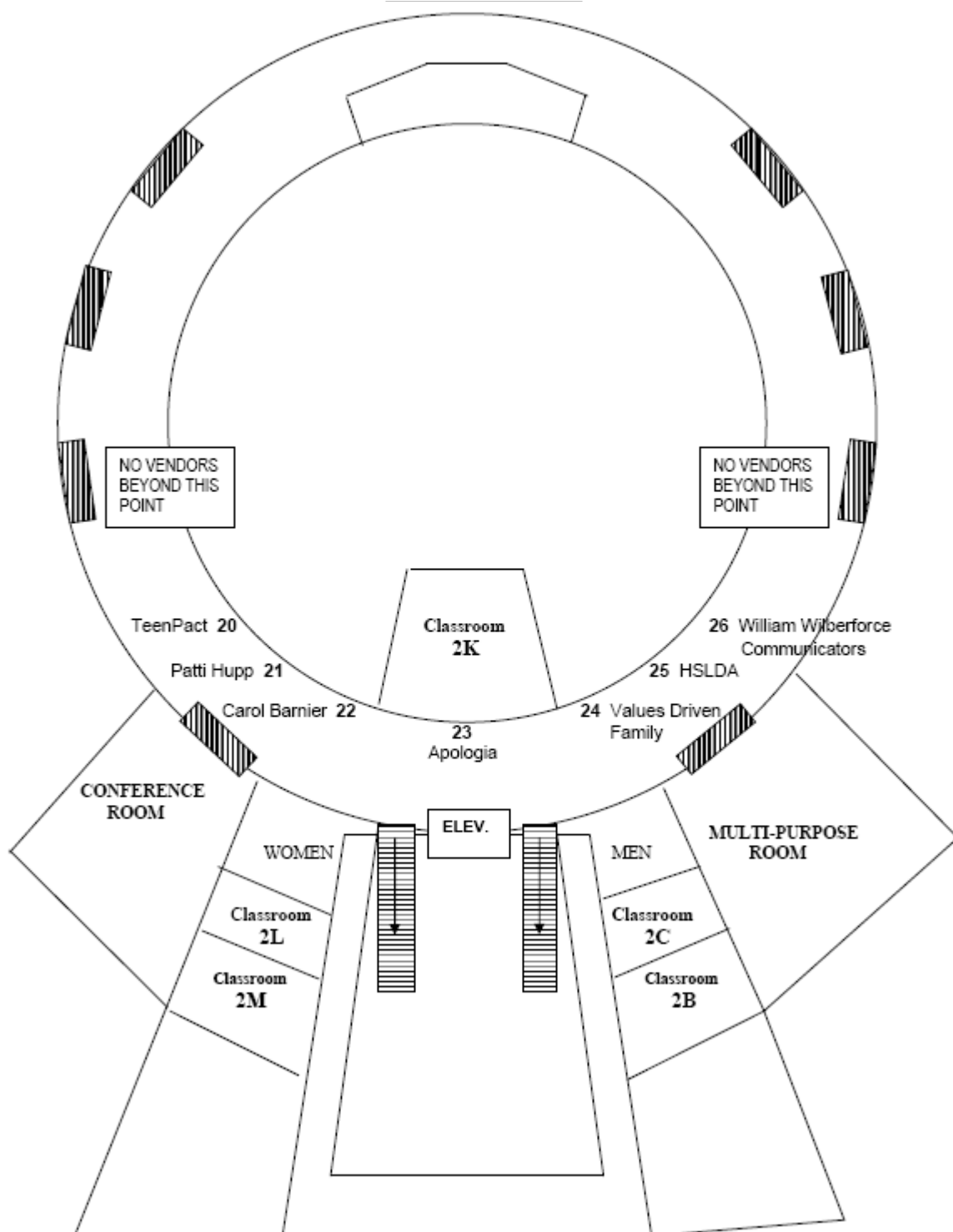
Homeschooling and the Law in CT (*John Kinsky*)
